#### Spring is the Season of New Growth

This series and this book call us to change our view of Sabbath as a mandate and see it as refreshment and healing. It is easy to get caught up in the swirl of social expectation to be constantly busy justifying our existence and proving our worth, constantly doing at the expense of resting in the Lord. Attitudes are not easily changed, and neither are our habits. We have sacrificed our spiritual growth on the altar of consumerism and constant consumption. God calls us away to rest. God calls us away to refresh. God calls us away to reset our soul and mind.

One thing I like about winter is letting the trees and gardens rest. As spring approaches, I start small; planting seeds inside until the weather settles and warmth radiates from the ground. Winter and early spring give me time to dream about the journey ahead of fresh fruits and vegetables. Now, however is the time to prepare for the growth to come.

The preparation for Easter is heightened and deepened by our Lenten observance. It is a time of planting the spiritual seeds that will continue to grow long after the celebration of Easter has faded from our minds and summer vacations move into the foreground. Learning to rest in the Lord, learning to embrace the Sabbath as a blessing is like the weather of spring, warmth and cold, forward and back until it finally becomes the warmth of our hearts, a fertile garden for our spiritual growth to bear fruit.

This year Easter is a little early, arriving on the last Sunday of March. Now is the time to sow the seeds of a more meaningful celebration. Now is the time to prepare the garden of our souls for renewed growth in Christ. Now is the time to listen and follow the voice of our Lord and Savior, taking one small step at a time.

#### **Gathering Hope Book Club**

Join us Monday, April 1st, as we discuss Sharon Garlough Brown's novella, REMEMBER ME. In this 120 page sequel to *Shades of Light*, Katherine Rhodes, the beloved director of the New Hope Retreat Center, finds her own grief tapped by Wren Crawford's struggles with depression and loss. Through a series of letters to Wren, Katherine reflects on the meaning of Christ's suffering and shares her own story of finding hope. How does one begin to live again under the crushing weight of grief? And how can healing come when there's so much left unresolved? With Katherine as a companion in sorrow, Wren moves forward in her commitment to paint the stations of the cross for a prayer journey at New Hope, discovering along the way a deeper communion with the Man of Sorrows, acquainted with grief. Readers are invited into a similar journey of reflection through Katherine's words and Wren's paintings. At the back of the book, a devotional guide with Scripture readings, prayer prompts, and full-color art provides the opportunity to ponder the depths of God's love by meditating on Jesus' journey to the cross.


# "It is finished,' Jesus says. It's a bold declaration for us to make too. What does it mean to say 'It is finished' when so much is unfinished?



Healing Service: the next healing service will be during the Easter worship service on Sunday, March 31st.



#### Finance Update

Dear members of the congregation,

As many of you in the congregation, know and understand, budgeting is not an exact science, especially for churches, where we rely on our members (through pledging) and on the Grace of God. This year's budget was exceptionally difficult as we struggled with escalating and unknown costs of utilities, insurance and possibly new regulations/requirements from Synod.

As a fiduciary body, the Consistory strives for transparency with the congregation. This is the first time we are presenting a budget with a current deficit. We do not present this lightly, but we got to a point where we felt this was the best option at this time.

We want you to know that we will be monitoring both the expenses and revenue closely throughout the year. We will continue to seek out grants for whatever programs we can. Currently, we have a grant to help fund VBS and another grant to help us update Fellowship Hall. Our general liability policy has been re-termed now to reflect a calendar year. It previously came due in March, which made budgeting more difficult.

Again, we want you to know how much we appreciate your tithes, time and talents. We also appreciate when you use the envelopes marked Classical Dues. In 2024, the church will be assessed \$139.46 per member. By contributing towards this cost, you are helping to free up funds for other missions and expenses.


Please feel free to contact any of us if you have any questions or concerns. We would love to hear your feedback.
