

Lesson in Lent

As I write this we are in the grip of winter. There is snow on the ground and a couple of storms lined up to hit us. It is a time to stay indoors out of the elements.

March 5 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lenten season. Lent is a time to go deep indoors of the soul, to examine our hearts and our motivations. This helps us grow in our faith. In the winter we spend more time inside than outside making it the perfect time to read and reflect. The more we consider what the



early disciples thought Jesus was saying to them the better we can apply the lessons of Jesus to our own life.

Part of embracing winter, with its snow, sleet and freezing rain, is the expectation and hope that winter didn't come to stay, it came to pass, and that beyond winter there is spring, a time of new growth. As we consider the parables of Jesus, we see a lesson for spiritual growth rising out of common everyday experiences. Jesus uses the typical farming practices and behaviors of life to teach a powerful lesson that can deepen our understanding of God and our relationship with the world. Sometimes the lessons are not clear with the first reading. Far too often people want just a simple do this or don't do that lesson. But Jesus wants us to grow the ability to think deeply and feel the presence of the Holy Spirit as we explore the teaching of Jesus.

This year I was preparing to start taping trees for sap and the production of Maple Syrup in the middle of January. But the weather wasn't right. Understanding the movement of sap in the maple trees and it's relationship to winter and spring helps us navigate the season and place taps at the time that will produce the best sap for evaporating down to syrup.


In much the same way the parables teach us to make spiritual and ethical decisions. Studying the parables of Jesus helps us navigate life and faith, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to a richer, fuller, more intimate relationship with God. It is gradual growth, not an overnight arrival. That is one of the things I love about growing in Christ, there is always more to learn.

Digging into the season of Lent, we are preparing ourselves to embrace the new growth that follows. Easter is the time of resurrection. Our journey through Lent and the study of Jesus' parables helps us appreciate and understand all the more the meaning of the resurrection of Jesus.

Just as in taping trees the first step is learning to identify sugar maples in the winter, so the first step of understanding the parables of Jesus, is learning to identify how his listeners first understood them, what their life was like, what were the expectations for the religious community. It is well worth the effort and the results will warm your heart, even on a cold winter day.

Another opportunity is on the Wednesdays of Lent. Jim will be leading a study of the book, "The Scandal of the Kingdom, how the parables of Jesus revolutionize life with God" by Dallas Willard. The group will read the whole book, but we will mainly focus on 6 chapters which will take us up to the week before Holy Week.

Another opportunity is the Women's Sunday morning study group. They will be working through a workbook based on Dallas Willards book. There is more information about these two study groups on the following page of this newsletter.

Lent is often known for giving up something or a habit. I would suggest that you take something on. Try committing to a half hour of prayer everyday during this season. Or, a mini fast one day a week, donating the cost of the food you would have eaten to Backpack Snack Attack. Yet another possible opportunity is to read a chapter a day from the Gospel of Mark. These are just a few suggestions.

March 26th – Lost and Found (chapter 9)


April 2nd – The Miracle of Forgiveness (chapter 11)

sweet treats with delightful old and new friends.



ASH WEDNESDAY

is an ancient holy day in the Christian church calendar. It marks the beginning of the season of Lent – a time of penitence, discipline, and renewal. In the Ash Wednesday service we are reminded of our mortality, we confess our sins, and we experience forgiveness through Christ's death and resurrection. Ashes will be available to those who wish to receive them.

In Scripture, ashes serve both as a symbol of mortality and a sign of mourning and repentance. But neither sin nor death are the final word. We leave the service in confidence and gratitude: Christ has conquered death, and nothing can separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

Also, this year we will have only 5 services choosing to skip a service on Sunday evening of March 23^{rd.}

The First Reformed Church of Walden will host three of the five Lenten Series Services this year. First on Ash Wednesday March 5th with Reverend O'Connell preaching on the topic "How Jesu Taught" (Chapter 2 in the book) based on scripture from Matthew 7:28-29. We will celebrate the Lord's Supper served via intinction and we will have the imposition of Ashes. There will be no fellowship time following this Ash Wednesday Series service.

Sunday night of March 9th, the Series will move to Wallkill Reformed Church at 45 Bridge Street in Wallkill. This evening will begin at 5 PM with desserts and fellowship followed at 6 PM with the service in which Reverend Ken Sampson will offer his sermon on "Growing Together" (Chapter 6) based on scripture from Matthew 13:24-50.

The third service will be hosted again by the First Reformed Church of Walden on what is the Second Sunday in Lent. March 16th. This evening like all the remaining Sunday evening services will start at 5 PM with desserts and fellowship followed by the service at 6 PM. This service will feature a sermon by Stan Seagren on the theme of "Lost and Found" (Chapter 9) based on scriptures from Luke 15. There will be no Lenten Series service for the following Sunday March 23rd. (Page 1 of 5 Worship)

I love to list for you the lyrics of our Hymns for these coming months as they are indeed very much like prayers we can use to glorify God at home. So here we go!

Our Hymn of the Month or the "Closing Hymn" for March will be #200 "Lord Who Throughout These Forty Days", an adapted American folk melody authored by Claudia F. Hernaman (1873) and harmonized by Annabel Morris Buchanan (1938). It is based on Matthew 4:1-11; Mark 1:12-13; Luke 4:1-13; Hebrews 4:15-16. We'll carry this over into the first two Sundays in April as well and then change that for Palm Sunday.

¹Lord, who throughout these forty days for us didst fast and pray, teach us with you to mourn our sins and close by you to stay.

² As you with Satan did contend, and did the victory win, O give us strength in you to fight, in you to conquer sin.

³ As you did hunger and did thirst, so teach us, gracious Lord, to die to self, and so to live by your most holy Word.

⁴ And thro' these days of penitence, and thro' your Passiontide, forevermore, in life and death, O Lord, with us abide.

⁵ Abide with us, that through this life of doubts and hope and pain, an Easter of unending joy we may at last attain!

The Closing Hymn beginning on Palm Sunday will be #204 "All Glory, Laud and Honor"; authored by Theodulph of Orleans (c. 820), translated by John M. Neale (1854), composed by Melchior Teschner (c. 1613) harmonized by William H. Monk (1861) with the descant composed by Donald P Justad (1989). It is based on scriptures from Matthew 21:8-9; Mark 11:8-10; Luke 19:36-38; John 12:12-15; and Jude.

Refrain: All glory, laud and honor to thee, Redeemer, King, to whom the lips of children made sweet hosannas ring.

¹ Thou art the King of Israel, thou David's royal Son, who in the Lord's name comest, the King and blessed One! [Refrain]

² The company of angels are praising thee on high, and we with all creation in chorus make reply: [Refrain]

³ The people of the Hebrews with palms before thee went; our praise and prayer and anthems before thee we present: [Refrain]

⁴ To thee, before thy passion, they sang their hymns of praise; to thee, now high exalted, our melody we raise: [Refrain]

⁵ Thou didst accept their praises— accept the prayers we bring, who in all good delightest, thou good and gracious King! [Refrain]

"Sing! A new creation" is a contemporary hymnal supplement with more than 270 songs chosen from the best of new hymns, global music, and choruses from such diverse sources as Iona, Maranatha, Taize, and Word. For each song, the text, tune, or both were written within the past 50 years. Spoken prayers, litanies, and responsorial psalms are also included.


